

Guidelines for Paper Submission

Commercialism

Authors are requested to avoid commercialism in their papers, visuals and talks. Authors may be instructed to revise their paper / presentation in accordance with requirements of the technical committee.

General Guidelines

The conference proceedings will be created from the submitted Word document by the author. The authors are requested to submit their paper according to the guidelines mentioned as below:

- The paper should be written in American English.
- The length of written paper should be restricted to 6 to 8 pages of A4 size including figures, tables, graphics etc.
- Papers should be in Microsoft Word format. PDF format is not acceptable.
- Papers should be typed in Times New Roman (with 12 size font, justify manner) and lines should be single spaced.
- Abbreviations shall be spelled out when it appears first time in the paper.
- The actual unit of measurement shall be precisely mentioned.
- If author uses graphic materials from other copyrighted sources, copyright holder to be properly acknowledged in a footnote/reference.
- Please submit tables as editable text and not as images.
- For Photographs & Figures, minimum 300 dpi resolution should be used.

General format of the paper

Title of Paper

The title of the paper should be in Times New Roman, Font size 14 bold.

Author Information

Name, designation, organization & email Id's of the paper presenter should be given first followed by co-authors. The name of authors should be in Times New Roman, Font size 12 bold and other details should be in Font size 11 Bold Italics.

Abstract

Max. 300 words abstract should be able to clearly state the significance of the paper (in Times New Roman, 12 Font).

Key Words

A list of relevant key words should be included to facilitate searching (in Times New Roman, 11 Font, Italics).

Introduction

An outline of the problem/subject and a brief explanation of the solution or review.

Experimental Procedure

If applicable, then description of the materials, heat treatments, tests details/ experimental procedures.

Results & Discussions

If applicable, results should be presented in a clearly manner in the form of text, graphs or tables. All terms used in the text, tables, graphs and illustrations should be well defined. Insert figures, tables in the running text and provide a gap of one line between the main text and the figure/table. All figures and tables should be consecutively numbered. Figure caption should appear at the bottom of the figure while table caption at the top of the table. Legends and other materials presented in the figure must be clear & readable.

Conclusions

Conclusions as well as their significance and application should be briefly stated.

Acknowledgments

Helps and supports received from individuals or organizations should be cited.

References

References should be numbered consecutively throughout the text as [Ref. No's]. The reference list should have the name of author/s followed by the title of the reference paper, and other relevant details.

Examples:

Reference to a journal publication:

Reference to a book:

Reference to a chapter in an edited book:
